The same is true for a church. Our baptism makes us a part of the body of the church. The apostle Paul reminds us when he says, "For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are member s of one another." (Romans 12: 4-5) However – our relationship with the church does not end there. There is much the church offers us, and much we should offer in return.

Membership is our public promise to St. James. It is each of us, standing up, and saying "St. James is my church. I believe in this church and all it stands for. I am a part of its life. I play a role in making decisions about its future." 

his past June, I had the privilege of representing St. James on a 10-day pilgrimage to Jerusalem, joining 26 other youth from throughout the Diocese, led by our Primate Abp. Khajag Barsamian and Fr. Mardiros Chevian. I wasn't sure what to expect when I arrived in Israel, but come to find out, it would be one of the most amazing experiences of my life.

The trip was an eye-opening and inspirational journey through Christ's footsteps. Seeing the sites of Christ's birth, where he preached His ministry, and where He was crucified truly brought everything that I have learned in the Armenian Church full-circle. At each site we visited, we read Bible passages, reminding us to exactly what happened. To be standing in the places where our Lord walked himself was an indescribable feeling. Places we visited, among many others, included Bethlehem, the Jordan River, the Sea of Galilee, Golgotha, the Temple Mount, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the Mount of Ascension, Jericho and the Dead Sea.

During our pilgrimage, our group had the rare opportunity to witness the enthronement of Archbishop Nourhan Manougian, the new Armenian Patriarch of Jerusalem. Spending several days at the Armenian Patriarchate with the clergy and the local Armenians of Jerusalem gave me a sense of pride for my heritage that could not be experienced anywhere else.

Another highlight of the trip was having the ability to celebrate the Feast of Ascension at the actual spot where Christ rose into heaven after giving His disciples the Great Commission. The service was celebrated simultaneously at the Chapel of the Ascension alongside members of the Coptic and Assyrian Churches.

I am so grateful to Mr. Aso Tavitian of New York who makes this trip possible for several years through his support and financial sponsorship; to Abp. Khajag and Fr. Mardiros for leading an amazing trip; and of course to Fr. Arakel and Maria Derderian for the confidence they bestowed upon me in selecting me to represent St. James on this unforgettable journey.





PASTORAL CARE: HOME AND HOSPITAL CLERGY VISITS

If you or someone you know is ill or hospitalized and would like to be visited, please call the church office at (617) 923-8860. Please note: when asked about your religion at a hospital, patients should list themselves as "Armenian Orthodox" or "Armenian" not "other."

REQUIEM SERVICE/HOKEHANKISD

Arrangements for Requiem Service, Altar Flowers and Candles should be made through the church office by Thursday at noon. In accordance with the canons of the Armenian Church, Requiem Services may not be performed on the five major feast days: Armenian Christmas, Easter, The Feast of the Transfiguration, The Feast of the Assumption of the Mother of God, and The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

BAPTISMS AND CHRISMATIONS

All baptisms must be scheduled at least two months in advance by calling the church office. According to the Armenian Church canons, a Baptism may only be performed once in a person's lifetime, provided such Baptism has been performed in a Christian Church and in the name of the Holy Trinity.

At least one of the godparents must be a member of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church.

WEDDINGS

Parishioners should contact the church office at least eight months in advance. A couple must contact St. James to confirm the availability of the Pastor and sanctuary prior to making any other arrangements.

All weddings must follow the Canons of the Armenian Apostolic Orthodox Church and the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. In accordance with Diocesan discipline mandated by the Primate, all Sacraments must be performed in the church sanctuary.

The couple must meet with the Pastor at least once for pre-marital preparation and counseling. Weddings cannot be performed during Great Lent or Holy Week, or on the five major feast days: Armenian Christmas, Holy Easter, The Feast of the Transfiguration, The Feast of the Assumption of the Mother of God, and The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

FUNERALS

Families should make arrangements with the funeral director of their choice, who will contact the church office to arrange the funeral service. Generally, St. James coordinates funerals with Bedrosian Funeral Home and Giragosian Funeral Home; both are located in Watertown and are familiar with our Church traditions.

Funerals may not be performed on religious holidays, major feast days, Saturdays after 3:00 p.m., or on Sundays.
